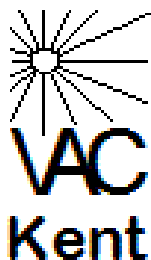

For all other conditions for vets, my typical fees are:

First Visit \$25.00
(Typically 1-1/2 hour)

Follow-up visits \$25.00
(Typically 1 hour)

Using FSM

I consider FSM a needleless form of electro-acupuncture since it does not use needles. Specifically, it is a form of interferential electro-acupuncture. In fact, most people do not feel a thing. Those that do only feel a slight tingling. Most but not all things I can do with acupuncture I can do with FSM although it usually takes longer. For example, my anti-inflammation electro-acupuncture treatment can quickly treat an inflamed nerve or tendon. It will usually only take 1-3 treatments and each treatment will only take 15 minutes per point. Whereas with FSM how long a treatment may take depends on how bad it is and may take up to 45 minutes or so and may take more treatments as well. But with FSM I also

have the option of doing the treatment remotely, which I cannot do with acupuncture. And I can even make liquid remedies of shorter FSM treatments (~80 minutes or less). I also can imprint the longer treatments on holographic stickers which you only have to keep in your magnetic field ~ 2-3 feet) to work so you can just put it in your pocket or purse (but not next to your phone) So, it really depends on what condition you are dealing with, what type of treatment is best. The stickers are a good way to extend the effect of a treatment. Sometimes you will have a choice in which case I will explain the pros and cons of each. FSM can do some things that acupuncture cannot. Such as treating shingles post-eruption. There are some conditions FSM can treat that you normally would not think of going to an acupuncturist for. Such things like a goiter or treating diabetic wounds that won't heal. Or concussions. To name a few. And my experience has been that acupuncture and FSM work well together since they work by entirely different mechanisms. I just cannot do FSM and electro-acupuncture in the same area. They will interfere with each other. The FDA licenses the machines as a form of TENS to treat pain although they work much differently. But FSM is good at treating pain too.

A chiropractor named Carolyn McMakin is the one who has brought

this technology into the 21st century. It is based on work that was done in the 1920's and 1930's that was squashed by the AMA in 1934 when they decided that doctors should only use drugs and surgery. I have been using it for almost 8 years now and it does work. I have learned how to do remote treatments and have done over 1,000 to date. I have also figured out how to make custom FSM treatment remedies and a way to make them work even better. The only thing that I have found that doesn't work is the combination of frequencies for a scar on the skin. Everything else I have tried has worked so far. There are things I have not had the chance to try yet such as treating a goiter. But they say it works quite well. And I have modified protocols successfully as well. For example, I treated the worst case of athlete's foot a podiatrist had ever seen and couldn't do anything for. However, I could by using the wound healing protocol with the modification of increasing the time that acute inflammation ran. It took a couple of months but it did clear up. So, with the knowledge I have and the tools available to me (like FSM), I can treat almost anything. And I can explain exactly how everything I do works. And if I can't help you, I will tell you that too. I may not be able to cure what ails you but I probably can help.
